GW: *We had a chance to see your performance on Volle Kraft Vorauss Festival and you made a very good impression. Do you have to prepare in some special way for this kind of events or it comes to you now rather naturally? Could you say something more about your impressions?*

M: I have to admit it was really cool! I had a chance to meet old friends but also new bands. I was really glad to be there and I really hope for the next concert!

GW: *And what about stage fright? Do you have one or it is like we said more or less routine now?*

M: Well after all those years it is fewer jitters, but the level of the excitement before every gig remains the same.

GW: *We know you also had a chance to perform in Russia and in Poland. Most of the bands from the west describe Slavic publicity as a different kind of energy - do you agree?*

M: Yes! We have so many fans in Russia! They are super people with great power, so it's easy to get their attention. They are also more expressive and I mean definitely MORE! They are crazy with really great feelings - they jump, they dance and on each side of the stage you can hear such "WHEEEEE!". We played also a few times in Poland and it was really cool...You are way more emotionally involved than we used to see from the stage...but it is easy to drink too much! (laughs).

GW: *Well... polish vodka might be deceptive (laughs). Do you like described energy and our way of expression? We are aware that might be sometimes annoying - especially after a show.*

M: No, no! We really like it! It is amazing, but when we are back and people are less expressive we have a feeling for a moment "Oh what's going on? Is something wrong?", but it's fine. This feeling was unexpected, but now we know that it's just a different type of energy.

GW: *If you got a chance to perform in Poland again would you be interested?*

M: I really, really hope for next gig in Poland!

GW: *Maybe during Jubilee Tour then?*

M: Well, Jubilee Tour is almost fully planned, except one bigger show right after. Unfortunately, I cannot reveal any additional information as it is still in the planning phase. But if we got an invitation from the polish local promotor, we would love to come again.
